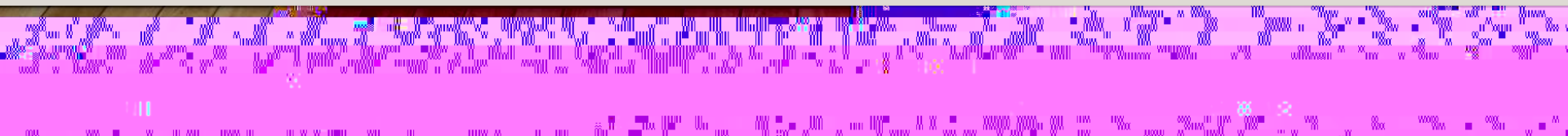

PLAN AHEAD – COLLEGE TESTING

- AP exams are scheduled in May
- PSAT is taken in October of junior and/or sophomore year
- SAT Reasoning Test and ACT are typically taken in the spring semester of the junior year
- Retake SAT /ACT, if necessary.

**Please note, these are private companies and there are additional costs attached to all of the above mentioned examinations.*

COLLEGE TESTING: STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (CLASSIFIED, DECLASSIFIED AND 504 STUDENTS:)

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- College Board and ACT require a separate application for testing accommodations for students with disabilities.
 - Classified Special Education students: College Board application is completed by student's primary teacher as early as 9th grade.
 - Declassified and 504 students: College Board application is completed by student's School Counselor as early as 9th grade.
 - ACT application is completed when the student registers for the ACT test in their junior year.
 - Testing accommodations from College Board and ACT are [l m r e s p l r c c b l b p c l m r g k k c b g r c](#). The testing company determines the eligibility.

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
